Supervision by a registered podiatrist is a requirement of this course. This course is available to assistants throughout Australia, New Zealand and Asia.

DELIVERY

This course is delivered through a combination of on-the-job training, self paced distance learning with workbooks and two weekend face-to-face workshops.

NB: Workshop #1 is held over two days. This workshop is to visually demonstrate techniques to students. This is the only time during the course students will receive face to face instruction on the procedures the Assistant will be expected to perform in their workplace environment. Workshop #2 is a one day event to review the course content, re-demonstrate any procedures and conduct final assessments of each student.

RECOGNISED PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

Students working in a health environment may be eligible for Recognised Prior Learning (RPL) through previous training, work and life experience. Eligible students may apply for RPL by contacting the Program Leader.

COURSE DURATION

The time to complete the course is estimated at 6-7 months.

COST

Individual students undertaking training and assessment of the 6 units: \$1,440
Individual students undertaking assessment only (RPL): \$ 200 per unit

QUALIFICATION

On successful completion of the course, the student will be awarded a *Statement of Attainment* for the 6 Podiatry Units. Students undertaking the full Certificate IV Allied Health Assistance qualification will receive a credit for the podiatry units.
